18 outlaws arrested; drugs and weapons recovered

According to the details, the Islamabad Police Ramna, Golra, Tarnol, Sangjani, Industrial Area, Noon, Shams Colony, Sihala, Humak, Phulgran and Shehzad Town police station teams arrested 16 accused involved in different criminal activities.

Police teams also recovered 1,044 gram hashish, 605 gram Ice, 317 gram heroin, 30 Bottle liquor, five pistols and one rifle with ammunition from their possession. Cases have been registered against them and further investigations are ongoing.

Additionally, during a special campaign launched for the arrest of proclaimed offenders and absconders, various police teams arrested two criminals.

Following the special directions of Inspector General of Police (IGP) Islamabad Syed Ali Nasir Rizvi, the Islamabad Police continues its effective crackdown against crime and criminal elements to ensure the peace and tranquility in the federal capital.

Two wanted members of criminal gangs arrested; valuables recovered

According to the details, the Islamabad Police Koral police team used technical and human resources and succeeded in apprehending two wanted members of criminal gangs.

Islamabad Police conducts mock exercise at IHC complex

2026 individuals checked during search operations across multiple police station jurisdiction

Following the directives of Inspector General of Police (IGP) Islamabad, Syed Ali Nasir Rizvi, special measures are being undertaken to curb criminal activities and ensure the safety and security of the federal capital.

In this regard, search and combing operations were conducted in the jurisdictions of multiple police stations under the supervision of zonal SPs. During these operations 2,062 individuals, 956 houses, 263 shops, 60 hotels, 732 motorcycles and 276 vehicles were thoroughly checked. Meanwhile three illegal residing Afghan nationals, 47 suspicious persons and 55 motorcycles were shifted to the police stations for legal proceedings. A suspect involved in drug trafficking was also arrested and 522 grams of hashish were recovered from his possession.

SSP Operations Islamabad Qazi Ali Raza, emphasized that the primary objective of these operations is to tighten the security cordon around criminal elements and further strengthen the overall security framework of the city.

He further added that Islamabad Police will continue indiscriminate action against criminals, land grabbers, and drug traffickers.

He also urged citizens to cooperate with the police and immediately report any suspicious activity to the nearest police station or through the emergency helpline "Pucar-15".

IGP Islamabad Syed Ali Nasir Rizvi chairs high-level meeting at Safe City Islamabad

According to the details, Inspector General of Police (IGP) Islamabad Syed Ali Nasir Rizvi, chaired a high-level meeting at Safe City Islamabad. The meeting was attended by all Deputy Inspectors General of Police (DIGs), Assistant Inspectors General of Police (AIGs), Senior Superintendents of Police (SSPs), Zonal Superintendents of Police (SPs), and other senior police officers.

IGP Islamabad conducted a comprehensive review of the overall law and order situation in the federal capital, as well as the measures taken for crime prevention. Senior officers briefed him in detail on ongoing counter-terrorism efforts, security arrangements at sensitive locations, intelligence-based operations, traffic management, and effective inter-agency coordination.

On this occasion, the IGP Islamabad issued clear directives, emphasizing that operations against criminal elements must be intensified without discrimination and that intelligence-led policing should be further strengthened. He directed that the security of sensitive installations and key locations be ensured at all costs, while courteous conduct and professionalism in dealing with citizens must be upheld.

He further stressed the need to improve police station culture, ensure the timely resolution of public complaints, and maintain strict adherence to merit in all actions.

Additionally, the IGP Islamabad directed that field policing, patrolling, and checking mechanisms be made more proactive and effective. He emphasized the need for prompt response at all times and directed that all available resources be utilized to safeguard the lives and property of citizens. He also called for a comprehensive strategy to improve traffic flow and facilitate the public.

Meanwhile, IGP Islamabad Syed Ali Nasir Rizvi chaired another meeting at the Central Police Office (CPO) Islamabad. The meeting was attended by DIG Headquarters Malik Jameel Zafar, along with the AIG Logistics and AIG General & Development. Administrative, welfare, and logistical matters were reviewed in detail.

On this occasion, the IGP Islamabad directed officers to align departmental affairs with modern requirements, ensure the optimal utilization of available resources, and further enhance the professional capacity of the force.
