36 criminals arrested, narcotics and weapons recovered

Following the special directives of Inspector General of Police (IGP) Islamabad Syed Ali Nasir Rizvi, an effective crackdown is ongoing across the federal capital to ensure the safety of citizens' lives and property by combating crime and arresting criminal elements.

In this regard, police teams from Women, Shalimar, Golra, Sumbal, Tarnol, Sabzi Mandi, Noon, Phulgran, Shahzad Town, Kohsar, Ramna, Sangjani, Shams Colony and Koral police station teams arrested 28 accused and recovered 1,780 gram hashish, 3535 gram heroin, 1008 gram ice, 11 pistols and one rifle with ammunition from their possession.

Cases have been registered against the arrested accused, and further investigation is in progress. Additionally, during a special campaign launched for the arrest of proclaimed offenders and court absconders, eight wanted criminals were also apprehended.

SSP Operations Islamabad Qazi Ali Raza, stated that Islamabad Police is fully committed to ensuring the safety of lives and property of the citizens in the federal capital. No one will be allowed to disturb the peace of the city. Protecting citizens remains the top priority of Islamabad Police.

He further requested citizens to immediately report any suspicious activity to the relevant police station or to the emergency helpline "Pucar-15", so that through the mutual cooperation between the police and the public, the city can be made free of crime.

SSP Operations Islamabad chairs high-level meeting on crime prevention
